Why Advocate

- The Australian Healthcare system is a multibillion \$ industry
 - in 2019 it was estimated at about 10% of GDP
 - \$170 bn estimate in FY 2018
 - \circ > 1M people working in the industry
 - General Practice 7% of that pie
- It is a major cost and major political issue for Commonwealth
 - The battle for a slice of the pie = advocate or see your % shrink to fill someone else's plate



Types of Advocacy

- Lobbying
 - Aims to directly influence policy
 - Direct discussion with MPs/Policy makers
 - Letter to local MP talking to the Minister
 - Discussions with bureaucrats
 - AGPA very active on PCIG-Prof Michael Kidd
- Social Impact
 - Aims to indirectly influence policy
 - For example, increase number of AGPA members which will increase lobbying influence
 - Influence public opinion
 - Media interviews, articles, letters to editor, social media, discussions with stakeholders & patients



The Message

- Three components of the primary healthcare system- all are essential
 - Ease of access for patients
 - Cost, appointment availability
 - Well trained GPs
 - Specialists like any other,10 years to train, GP shortage in all areas, competing with other specialties for graduates
 - Infrastructure General Practices
 - Privatised delivery with a mix of public and private funding
 - Mainly small businesses investment in better systems is dependent on profitability/sustainability



The Message (2)

- Our concern is for the continuation of a world class primary healthcare system for the benefit of all Australians
 - Beware the media and political spin of the 'greedy doctor syndrome' – at all times put patient care first
 - Explain that doctors and practices need to meet rising costs – if they don't there won't be any practices



Lobbying Your Local MP

- Who is your local MP
 - Federal Electorate: <u>Australian Electoral Commission</u>
 - Federal Member: Parliament of Australia
 - Contact details, Party site
 - Margin: Tally Room Archive
- What are their interests First speech
- Making an appointment
 - Write a letter, make an appointment
- Meeting with them
 - Topics & talking points no need to ambush them



Lobbying Your Local MP

- 1. **<u>Connect</u>** with the individual build a relationship of mutual respect
 - a) They are more likely to help you if they think your relationship is genuine
 - b) Use anecdotes politicians are socio-political people they understand anecdotes
- 2. <u>Convince</u> them the issue is important and that you are an important constituent.
 - a) GPs are respected community members with influence we can influence their future
 - b) Mention our reach 5 to 10 000 patients is a lot in a standard electorate of ~ 100 000 voters
 - c) Mention the strength of our relationship with our patients intimacy and meaning
 - d) Mention the goodwill the practice has built over the years it has been operating ie 75 years vs their 3 years
 - e) Mention your monthly patient email/newsletter and how you are sharing your policy concerns with them.
- 3. <u>Commit</u> to checking back in with them. Ask for their personal contact details if not offered. "Can you let me know what the Minister/Shadow Minister said?"



Why is Your Health being undervalued?

- Messages
 - The Federal Government has given up on supporting your access to General Practice care.
 - From 2010 2019 health inflation was about 5% per year.
 - State health, pharmacy funding and private health insurance all increased by about 5%.
 - Your Medicare rebate increased by only 0.5% per year. The Federal Government has also reneged on a 2019 election promise to invest \$450m in General Practice.
 - Make sure your GP is supported this Federal Election.
 - Consider which Government will support your GP to support your community.
